

Pupil Premium 2018-19 – Actual



The pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England. It's designed to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities perform better, and close the gap between them and their peers.

In the 2018 to 2019 financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each pupil registered as eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years:

- £1,320 for pupils in reception to year 6
- £935 for pupils in year 7 to year 11

Barriers to educational achievement can include SEND support, family/home involvement, levels of access to enrichment opportunities and extra curriculum activities. Some children benefit from working in small groups where specific needs such as social, emotional and therapy needs can be supported to boost individual learning. We aim to address these barriers by individually tailoring our provision by offering interventions specifically tailored to the child.

Magdalen Farm	We are a rural community and pupils need to understand their local environments and economies to the best of their ability.	6,500	Regular visits have increased pupil's understanding of farming & grown pupil's self-esteem, confidence and ability to work as a team
Free School Milk	Many of our families are from lower incomes and offering milk to drink ensures, in term time, a daily calcium requirement is met	£185	Pupils where needed, have had a healthy drink
